Quick Facts about the Organization

Program Description

This versatile program is designed for students who want to focus on business, design, and innovation through a practical approach. Visit local companies, meet Spanish entrepreneurs, and choose marketing and entrepreneurship courses at our partner, the University of Vic – Central University of Catalonia (UVic-UCC), and round out your experience by choosing from a wide range of elective and core courses at the CEA Barcelona Center. Courses are taught in English, but Spanish language courses are available for every level of ability. You may also enroll in the optional Global Career Development Seminar, an ideal way to focus on future career success.

Program Structure

Enroll in 1-2 UVic-UCC elective courses, 1 CEA core course, and 1-3 CEA elective courses. Courses meet for 45 contact hours/3 credits per semester. You may also choose to enroll in the Global Career Development Seminar course, which meets for 15 contact hours/1 credit. Overall, semester students may earn a total of 12-16 credits (up to 240 contact hours) and academic year students may earn a total of 24-32 credits (up to 480 contact hours).

Typically, courses meet twice per week, Monday-Thursday. Active learning components required by your courses may be scheduled for Fridays.

Prior to departure, you will select your preferred courses and take an online language placement exam. You will be enrolled into courses based on their availability. It is in your best interest to have multiple alternative courses approved by your home university prior to your departure due to course availabilities. If you choose to take a Spanish language or elective course, to ensure that you receive credit for the language level you place into, have your home university pre-approve courses at several levels before you leave for Spain. Please consult with your academic advisor at your home university on credit pre-approval guidelines.

Course Information

CEA Barcelona Center

Courses taught at the CEA Barcelona Center have been designed in conjunction with, and approved by, the University of New Haven (UNH). UNH also approves faculty appointments. After the successful completion of a session at the CEA Barcelona Center, students will receive credit for their work from UNH.

- Classes are taught by international faculty.
- Most faculty are bilingual (Spanish/English) and represent a variety of different backgrounds.
- Periodic exams, homework assignments, and final exams will be administered.

- Attendance in all classes is mandatory and monitored by each professor.
- You'll attend class with other CEA students of equivalent language levels, not with native Spanish students.
- Teaching styles in Spain may differ from those in the U.S. Be prepared to adapt to your school's classroom structures and coursework expectations.
- The maximum class size is 15 students for language courses and 25 students for electives. Small class sizes mean more personalized attention from your instructors.

Professors at the CEA Barcelona Center carefully evaluate student's work and progress throughout their academic session. When calculating final grades, instructors consider written and oral exercises, homework assignments, attendance, classroom participation, and exam performance.

Completion of a course is defined as a receipt of a letter grade (A+ to F) as opposed to Withdrawal or Incomplete.

In order to determine a quality point ratio, each letter grade from a completed course is assigned a quality point value. The quality point value for each grade earned during a semester is multiplied by the number of semester hours assigned to that course. The sum of these points is the total number of quality points earned during the semester. It is divided by the number of semester hours completed to obtain the quality point ratio (QPR).

University of Vic – Central University of Catalonia

The University of Vic - Central University of Catalonia (UVic-UCC) is an independent, state-supported, educational institution with a distinctive international focus. UVic-UCC is committed to the economic and social development of Barcelona and Catalonia through teaching, research, and knowledge transfer. The university emphasizes multilingual training as a key to increased mobility of university students and staff, and views the study of language and culture as an excellent vehicle for gaining a wider awareness of today's world.

UVic-UCC offers 32 bachelor's degrees in the fields of arts, humanities, science, health sciences, social sciences, and engineering, 15 master's degree programs, and six doctoral programs. UVic-UCC's compliance with European directives on higher education, and the more-than 20,000 students who have put their trust in the university over the years, is testament to UVic-UCC's dynamism, innovation, and quality. The UVic-UCC International Campus, an umbrella organization for UVic-UCC activities aimed at an international public, provides mobility and exchange programs, postgraduate courses, research programs, continuing education, and international cooperation projects.

The UVic-UCC campus is on the same metro line as the CEA Barcelona Center, just a 10-minute ride away.

- International faculty will teach marketing and entrepreneurship courses.
- Homework assignments and final exams will be administered.
- Attendance in all classes is mandatory and monitored by each professor.
- Teaching styles in Spain may differ from those in the U.S. Be prepared to adapt to UVic-UCC's classroom structures and coursework expectations.
- Class size is a maximum of 25 to 30 students.
- You will attend class with international students. Due to the superior mastery of the language required, you will not be in classes with host national students.

The Spanish grading system is based on a scale of 10, as opposed to 100 in the U.S. system; however, grading varies from subject to subject. For example, in mathematics, a student may receive a 10 for completing all the problems correctly, whereas in the humanities, a 7 on an essay is considered very acceptable. Grading in Spain can be severe, and grades of 9 and 10 are rare. Transcripts from Spanish universities list both numerical and verbal grades.

Per University of Vic, interpretation of the Spanish grading scale is as follows:
